# From the Senior Pastor

2021 continued the 2020 trend of being a year of change and flux at Wagga Wagga Evangelical Church (WWEC). Not only did we face the on-going challenges of navigating the impacts of COVID-19 on the life of our gatherings, but more significantly, we farewelled our senior pastor, Peter Blanch and his family from our midst. This was indeed a 'bitter-sweet' occasion. We joyfully and gladly supported their decision to leave and take up a new and important gospel opportunity with Reach Australia, and yet at the same time we grieved and lamented the personal impacts of their departure. I have certainly felt the impact of this change personally. It has been a privilege to work under and alongside Pete for the last 5 years at WWEC, and while I wholeheartedly supported their decision to shift, I, like others, was very sad to see them go.

Despite the personal grief, I am extremely grateful to God for the way he has worked through the Blanchs during their time at WWEC. I am directly indebted to Pete for first preaching the gospel to me in 2009, personally investing in me and training me as an MTS worker in 2011-12 and then giving me my first opportunity as a pastor post-college in 2017. It is only because of God's grace (through Pete's influence) that I was willing, ready and excited to step into the role of new senior pastor at WWEC as he transitioned out.

My prayer is that God will continue to work equally as powerfully by His Spirit, through His word in this new season at WWEC; to continue to grow and shape our church in the likeness of Christ all to His praise and glory in Wagga.






#### Magnification

Glorifying God and devoted to Him, by loving, worshipping and delighting in Him. The Christian life is a journey. Colossians 2:6-7 puts it like this: 'so then, just as you received Christ Jesus as Lord, continue to live your lives in him, rooted and built up in him, strengthened in the faith as you were taught, and overflowing with thankfulness'.

Christians come to know Christ Jesus as Lord, but our story doesn't end there. We continue to grow into mature disciples: people who are part of a loving community, changed by God's word, gladly serving our Lord and involved in his mission in the world - all with a soft heart that seeks to glorify God in all things.

The 5 Ms - Magnification, Mission, Membership, Maturity and Ministry - break this journey down into stages, each one building and overlapping with the others. Together, they remind us how God works to build his church. They also help us to focus holistically on people and all aspects of our ongoing journey: from seeing people saved to helping them continue as healthy disciples of Jesus.

The 5 M purpose model has been adopted and used at WWEC since 2011. It ultimately enables us to be intentional as we seek to live out the Great Commission to make disciples, and the Great Commandment to love God and each other.



# Membership

In God's kindness we continue to see many people visit, connect and join our church family at WWEC. In 2021 we had a total of 71 visitors come to WWEC looking for a church to attend regularly. 59 of these folk (43 adults and 16 kids) decided to call WWEC home! With great delight we also welcomed 5 new babies to existing church members. Sadly we said good-bye to 34 members (18 adults, 16 kids): 2 families moved to pursue gospel employment outside of Wagga, 7 families moved towns for work, 3 families joined other churches in Wagga.

Despite overall numbers at WWEC increasing the average weekly church attendance is slightly concerning. We have 175 adults and 120 kids who consider WWEC 'their church', however our weekly attendance average for 2021 was 125 adults and 85 kids (9am and 11am combined). This means that week-to-week 50 adults and 35 kids are missing from church! The bounce-back from COVID has certainly played a part in this, but it remains an area we ought address as a church. Given that we are the 'body of Christ' we need to ensure that we are taking this seriously, for the good of the body and the glory of God.

"The Lunch@Ours in February was an informal, relaxed way to get to know other church members better. Sometimes after church there's not enough time to chat to people. Over lunch I enjoyed catching up with old friends plus getting time to meet new people to WWEC. I look forward to the next one."



One of the things we value greatly at WWEC is the deepening of our fellowship with one another. We have continued to build this into the 'fabric' of our church by running whole church lunches at times throughout the year. 'Lunch@Ours' was a roaring success with over 130 church members meeting in 12 different households on the same day to express and celebrate our unity in Christ.

Our 3-week membership course, 'Newish', continues to be a wonderful way for those who are new or newish to hear more about our church. It's a chance for people to ask questions about church governance and structure, as well as the areas of ministry they may be involved in serving or being trained in the future. Newish ran twice in 2021, with 29 adults and 12 kids (from 19 different families) attending.








#### Goals for 2022

At WWEC we aim to be a church family who love God's word and are growing in trust and obedience to it daily. We continue to keep God's word central to all that we do, ensuring that we are growing as mature disciples of Christ.

The preaching plan for church in 2021 included the following series:

We also launched the WWEC Podcast in 2021 which has been a huge blessing to our congregation locally and to the many who were unable to attend church face to face.



#### Goals for 2022

- Build a pipeline for training, equipping and developing new leaders.
- Multiply and grow our current number of Bible study groups.

Bible Study groups continue to be the engine room for discipleship in close-knit groups. The core aims continue to be learning from God's word, encouraging and challenging each other and caring for each other through the ups and downs of life.

In 2021 we had 12 Bible study groups running each week, 9 held during evenings and 3 daytime groups (including men's, women's and mixed groups). Over 125 members were a part of a regular Bible study group in 2021and we greatly desire to see these groups thrive in 2022.










At the end of 2021 we had 15 ministry teams. In these teams we have over 120 people actively engaged in serving. This represents 75% of suitable adults serving in ministry, an increase of 7% from 2020.

In 2021 our new flywheel system was established to create a proactive way of recruiting and training our volunteers for effective service. Every three months our various teams attend training days to help equip members. As well as these days, on the job training continues for those new to serving in each area as people share their wisdom and experience.
















#### Jesus Seriously

Our 5 week 'Jesus-Seriously!?' course continues to be the engine room of conversion for our church. It has been wonderful to see existing christians come along to be re-grounded in their foundations of belief and new/non Christians be invited to explore the claims about Jesus more closely. 'Jesus-Seriously!?' ran 3 times in 2021 and was attended by 10 non/new Christians and 5 committed Christians. Excitingly 5 attendees made expressions of faith and 4 of those began to attend WWEC regularly.

"I was approached after a couple visits to WWEC with an invite to the 'Jesus-Seriously!?' course. Tim explained to me the purpose and scope of Jesus-Seriously and I decided to attend as I was still on the fence about Christianity at the time.

The first session involved Tim teaching us on the historical and biblical claims of Jesus to lay out context, as well as getting us all to share what our assumptions were. This helped us establish where our knowledge gaps were, and what topics of interest to focus on.

The discussion was always two-way which was great for all participants, including myself. By the end I had a greater understanding of Jesus and why he died for our sins. It has helped me understand the preaching better as I continued to attend WWEC and it eventuated in me being baptised.

In retrospect, it is one of those courses I would gladly attend again just to experience and perhaps pick up some details I may have missed. My hopes for the future is WWEC offers similar or more advanced courses in this format."





We find great joy in seeing the teens come to terms with the reality of Jesus, recognising Jesus' loving call on their life and responding to him in faith.









# 2021 Financial Report

In 2021 the Administration Committee set an ambitious income target of \$32,000 per month. The aim was to achieve a surplus to allow us to recoup some of the savings that were spent in previous years. There were some ups and downs with regard to the monthly giving. Throughout the year we received an average of \$30,252 per month. This left a shortfall of about \$1,750 each month, which over the year totalled \$20,971.

With regard to expenditure in 2021 we did actually spend more than our budget. This was mainly due to Peter Blanch resigning as Senior Pastor and the associated costs of paying out leave, superannuation etc.

Total Income for 2021 = \$363,029 Total Expenditure for 2021 = \$342,882 Surplus for 2021 = \$20,632

#### **WWEC Board of Reference**



## Farewell Blanchs



















As part of this, in November 2021 a team from RA came to WWEC to do a church assessment and consult (with both staff and key leaders). The aim of this was to assess the health of our church against key growth indicators. Additionally the RA team sought to identify what present blockages to growth & vitality existed at WWEC. From this they recommended a range of goals to ensure WWEC's long term health as a church.

The RA team generated a report that revealed some interesting insights for us to consider as a church moving forward. There was much positive member feedback about the clear priority of our church to be Biblically faithful, Christ-focused and God-glorifying. There were also a number of challenges identified. Chief among these were the limitations we face because of (1) our current staffing shortage and (2) not having our own property to meet in. Both of these areas need to be addressed in the short to medium term and will require prayer and generosity from WWEC members.

Another area of concern was the trend in attendance data. This suggests WWEC may be moving from a long period of stable growth and beginning to plateau. This needs to be addressed quickly for the long-term spiritual health of our members, fellow Christians throughout Wagga, and those who don't know Jesus yet.

Two areas need to be addressed that relate to attendance.

- ♦ WWEC Service Times: The current 9am & 11am service times are a continued holding pattern since covid interruptions began in 2020. While they served us well for a time, they're now hindering the ability of members to deeply connect with each other (due to limited time between the two service times, and the lack of a distinct seperate space for fellowship). This is being discussed in order to have possible solutions in the near future.
- ◆ Continued Growth & Christian Conversion: We must be overtly committed to seeing people in Wagga come to faith in Jesus. By God's grace we've seen several locals become christians at WWEC and we all must continue to be passionately and creatively reaching Wagga with the gospel. As well as increasing our visible presence in Wagga, we have a goal to further equip our church members for mission personally. We want WWEC to do more than just survive. We want WWEC to thrive under God.
