Position Description

Purpose

Our goal at WEC is to **make and mature disciples of Jesus**. The sound team make a significant contribution to that by providing the best possible opportunity for those attending WEC to sing God's praises, engage with God's word and be informed of what is happening within our church family. The sound team do this by ensuring key information is heard by all in attendance. Without the sound team we would not easily hear God's word preached. They play a particularly important role in their influence on the sound and quality of the music. Without the sound team we would be limited in our ability to collectively praise God through song. Sound can be taken for granted at church - until something goes wrong! When this happens everyone at WEC realises how important the sound is to the successful running of a church service. Overseeing the sound team is therefore a very important task. A sound team is not simply doing a task, but bringing great honour to God as they love our church family and newcomers, helping them to hear all components of the WEC service through the sound equipment.

Brief Description

The Sound team member will be responsible for providing the sound at our Sunday services.

Detailed Description

- 1. If a member of the 9am Sound team arrive at 8am. If a member of the 11am Sound team arrive at 10.30am.
- 2. Follow instructions given in 'Serving Guide Sound'.

Expectations

- Team members will be part of the team for the year (not limited to that time) and are encouraged to review their participation in this ministry at the end of the calendar year
- Team members will complete the sound desk task on the dates they are assigned on the WEC Roster. Where unavailable the team member will try to swap with another sound team member. This is most effectively completed via the What's App WEC Sound group chat. When a swap is made please;
 - text your Sound Team Leader

- forward the reminder SMS received on the Friday before a Sunday service to the team member who agreed to swap
- Team members will be attending a Sunday service regularly
- Team members will adhere to WEC Safe Church policy and agree with the WEC Volunteer Code of Conduct
- Team members will attend meetings/trainings for the Sound Team.
- Team members will know how to complete the task of sound and be familiar with all equipment through training and on-the-job training by the leader & other team members
- Team members will advise the Sound Team Leader when equipment for their role is in need of repair or missing
- Team members will understand and adhere to the WEC WHS procedure for incidents & hazards. If an incident occurs during set up an 'Incident form' needs to be completed and provided to the Sound Team Leader. If the team member identifies a hazard/near miss during set up a 'Hazard/Near Miss form' needs to be completed and provided to the Sound Team Leader
- Team members will take an interest in praying for other members of their team and church family
- In the event of any issues that arise in the course of serving in this ministry, the team member is to bring them to their team leader. If this is not possible, the team member can bring their concern to the Director of Magnification.

Accountability

Sound Team Members are to work under, support and accept the authority of Sound Team Leader.
